About the TOEFL Junior Standard

The TOEFL Junior standard tests is a paper – delivered test that measures Reading Comprehension, Listening Comprehension and Language Meaning. The TOEFL Junior intended for students ages 11+, provide real insight into your students' English communication skills to help you make the best decisions and guide them on a path to success. Currently it is available in over 65 countries around the world.

What is TOEFL Junior Standard for?

The tests can be used in multiple ways in the classroom for placement and to monitor progress. Plus, scores are mapped to [CEFR levels](#) to help you better understand students' English proficiency levels

The TOEFL Junior designed to:

- English language programmes, for placement and progress monitoring.
- Exchange programs that bring international students for one year, or prep schools that recruit international students.
- International schools where the language of instruction is English.
- Schools in non-English speaking countries that focus on teaching content through English.

Score Reports

The *TOEFL Junior*[®] Standard test is scored locally by ETS Preferred Network offices and features fast turnaround time.

TOEFL Junior test scores are determined by the number of questions a student has answered correctly. There is no penalty for wrong answers. The number of correct responses on each section is converted to a scale score of 200–300 points. The total score is a sum of the three section scores, and, therefore, ranges from 600–900 points.

Each *TOEFL Junior* score report provides:

- both section and overall score levels to assist parents, students and teachers in understanding what the scores mean
- a description of the English-language abilities typical of test takers scoring around a particular scaled score level to help identify strengths and areas for improvement
- section test scores mapped to score levels of the [Common European Framework of Reference \(CEFR\)](#)
- a [Lexile® measure](#) *to help you find books at the student's English reading level*

In addition to a score report, the TOEFL Junior program also offers certificates of achievement based on scores and CEFR levels that you can award to your students. It's one way to provide students and parents with a sense of accomplishment.
